

----- UPCOMING AND IMPORTANT EVENTS -----

SUN, JAN 8 – CELEBRATION OF THE FEAST OF THE THEOPHANY (Actual Feast date is January 6th). Christ's baptism in the Jordan, is considered a theophany or manifestation of God. It marked the beginning of the Lord's public life. He would go from the Jordan to the wilderness and be tempted, then return to begin His public ministry. In the thought of the Greek Fathers this event was the New Testament's first revelation of the Holy Trinity. All three Persons were made manifest together: the Father testified from on high to the divine Sonship of Jesus; the Son received His Father's testimony; and the Spirit was seen in the form of a dove, descending from the Father and resting upon the Son. This is the theophany recalled in the troparion of the feast: "At Your baptism in the Jordan, O Lord, the worship of the Trinity was revealed; ..."

----- A NEW YEAR: 2023 – A RENEWED COMMITMENT ------

A NEW YEAR brings with it the hope of new behaviors, new attitudes, new beginnings and more. We reflect on our previous year's accomplishments and setbacks, and endeavor to do greater things in the year ahead. In many ways, this is a Byzantine Christian approach, as we remember that "God became man, so that man might could become God" (St. Athanasius). As St. Athanasius teaches us, we are constantly in the process of *theosis*, becoming more like God. Let us together review our stewardship towards His Church and consider where we might be able to grow in 2023. Here are some questions to ponder:

- **Time**: How can I faithfully give God my time? Can I be of service with a ministry? Attend the PAC meetings? Be on time regularly for Divine Liturgy? Pray for those on the prayer list at my icon corner?
- **Talent**: Can I be of service during the liturgy? Should I join the choir? Will I learn how to bake *Qurban* (holy bread) this year? Can I make food for or visit parishioners who are sick?
- Treasure: As I review my donations as listed on my 2022 contribution statement, does this fully reflect what God has given me? What is He directing me to pledge for 2023?





--- Remembering Pope Benedict XVI ---

10 Quotes on Love, Death, Hope, Mary, and Marriage

- (1) Quite soon, I shall find myself before the final judge of my life. Even though, as I look back on my long life, I can have great reason for fear and trembling, I am nonetheless of good cheer, for I trust firmly that the Lord is not only the just judge, but also the friend and brother who himself has already suffered for my shortcomings, and is thus also my advocate, my 'Paraclete.' In light of the hour of judgment, the grace of being a Christian becomes all the more clear to me. It grants me knowledge, and indeed friendship, with the judge of my life, and thus allows me to pass confidently through the dark door of death. In this regard, I am constantly reminded of what John tells us at the beginning of the Apocalypse: he sees the Son of Man in all his grandeur and falls at his feet as though dead. Yet He, placing his right hand on him, says to him: 'Do not be afraid! It is I...' (cf. Rev 1:12-17)
- (2) A Christian knows when it is time to speak of God and when it is better to say nothing and to let love alone speak.
- (3) My dear young friends, I want to invite you to 'dare to love.' Do not desire anything less for your life than a love that is strong and beautiful and that is capable of making the whole of your existence a joyful undertaking of giving yourselves as a gift to God and your brothers and sisters, in imitation of the One who vanquished hatred and death for ever through love (cf. Rev 5:13).
- (4) Seeing with the eyes of Christ, I can give to others much more than their outward necessities; I can give them the look of love which they crave.
- (5) "The consciousness that, in Christ, God has given himself for us, even unto death, must inspire us to live no longer for ourselves but for him, and, with him, for others. Whoever loves Christ loves the Church, and desires the Church to be increasingly the image and instrument of the love which flows from Christ.
- (6) If you follow the will of God, you know that in spite of all the terrible things that happen to you, you will never lose a final refuge. You know that the foundation of the world is love, so that even when no human being can or will help you, you may go on, trusting in the One that loves you.
- (7) Mary is the woman of hope...Mary is a woman of faith... Mary is a woman who loves... Mary has truly become the Mother of all believers. Men and women of every time and place have recourse to her motherly kindness and her virginal purity and grace, in all their needs and aspirations, their joys and sorrows, their moments of loneliness and their common endeavours. They constantly experience the gift of her goodness and the unfailing love which she pours out from the depths of her heart.
- (8) Marriage is linked to faith, but not in a general way. Marriage, as a union of faithful and indissoluble love, is based upon the grace that comes from the triune God, who in Christ loved us with a faithful love, even to the Cross.
- (9) We have come to believe in God's love: in these words the Christian can express the fundamental decision of his life. Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction.
- (10) Holiness does not consist in never having erred or sinned. Holiness increases the capacity for conversion, for repentance, for willingness to start again and, especially, for reconciliation and forgiveness.
