Luke 13: 10-17 - At that time Jesus was teaching in one of their synagogues on the Sabbath. And behold, there was a woman who for eighteen years had had a sickness caused by a spirit; and she was bent over and utterly unable to look upwards. When Jesus saw her, he called her to him and said to her, "Woman, thou art delivered from thy infirmity." And he laid his hands upon her, and instantly she was made straight, and glorified God. But the ruler of the synagogue, indignant that Jesus had cured on the Sabbath, addressed the crowd, saying, "There are six days in which one ought to work; on these therefore come and be cured, and not on the Sabbath." But the Lord answered him and said, "Hypocrites! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or ass from the manger, and lead it forth to water? And this woman, daughter of Abraham as she is, whom Satan has bound, lo, for eighteen years, ought not she to be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?" And as he said these things, all his adversaries were put to shame; and the entire crowd rejoiced at all the glorious things that were done by him.

----- CONFESSION IN THE MELKITE TRADITION ------

The Bible tells us that "The Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" (Matthew 9:6). We also read that the risen Lord enabled the Church to forgive sin in His name when He appeared to the apostles after His resurrection: "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven..." (John 20:23). The Mystery of Repentance (Confession) is the Church's principal way to exercise this ministry. Because the Church encourages us to go to confession during the fasting seasons, the Nativity Fast is a good time to consider going to confession. We prepare for confession by reviewing what we have done (and failed to do) in light of the Gospel. There are booklets available from the bookstore or the clergy to help us prepare for confession. In addition to the set times for confession posted in the bulletin, Father Elias is available for Confession by appointment. In our tradition, it is customary for the priest to hear confession before an icon of Christ. This reminds us that it is Christ to whom we are confessing. That is why Father sometimes stands near the Icon of Christ at the front of the Church during Orthros. During confession, the priest may ask questions or make suggestions. At the end, he will place the end of his epitrachelion (stole) over our bowed head and say the prayer of absolution. Afterwards, we may kiss the stole and the priest's hand.

How do we go to confession? What are the steps?

- 1. Approach the icon and make three metanies, along with the priest, saying each time: "God be propitious to me, the sinner, and have mercy upon me."
- 2. The priest will give you a blessing and make the sign of the cross over you: "Blessed is our God at all times, now and always and forever and ever."
- 3. He may ask the following questions to help you get started: "Have you asked the Lord pardon for all your sins and offenses? Is there anything in particular you would like to confess?"
- 4. State your sins simply, without going into extreme detail.

--- THE SABBATH MIRACLE ---

GOD ALLOWS SATAN AND SIN TO BIND THIS WOMAN. CYRIL OF ALEXANDRIA: "There was in the synagogue a woman who for eighteen years was bowed down by infirmity." Her case may prove to be of great benefit to those who have understanding. We must gather what is to our advantage from every quarter. By what happened to her, we may see that Satan often receives authority over certain persons who fall into sin and have grown lax in their efforts toward piety. Whomever he gets into his power, he may involve in bodily diseases since he delights in punishment and is merciless.... The accursed Satan is the cause of disease to the human bodies, just we affirm that Adam's transgression was his doing, and by means of it our bodily frames have become liable to infirmity and decay. COMMENTARY ON LUKE, HOMILY 96.

JESUS OVERCOMES DEATH AND DESTRUCTION. CYRIL OF ALEXANDRIA: The incarnation of the Word and his assumption of human nature took place for the overthrow of death, destruction and the envy harbored against us by the wicked Serpent, who was the first cause of evil. This plainly is proved to us by facts themselves. He set free the daughter of Abraham from her protracted sickness, calling out and saying, "Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity." A speech most worthy of God, and full of supernatural power! With the royal inclination of his will, he drives away the disease. He also lays his hands upon her. It says that she immediately was made straight. It is now also possible to see that his holy flesh bore in it the power and activity of God. It was his own flesh, and not that of some other Son beside him, distinct and separate from him, as some most impiously imagine. COMMENTARY ON LUKE, HOMILY 96.
